JUST-IN-TIME INFORMATION ON JIE APPLICATION (JAN 2026 INTAKE)

Information For Students on Key Dates for Jan 2026 intake

1. All N(A)* / N(T) school leavers are encouraged to submit an application during the **1st Phase (Main Phase)** between **18 Dec 2025 (2.30 p.m.) to 22 Dec 2025 (5 p.m.)**. Application results for the 1st Phase will be released on **26 Dec 2025 from 9 a.m.**
2. If you wish to appeal, please accept the course offered **before** applying in the **2nd Phase (Late Application/Appeal Phase)** between **26 Dec 2025 to 2 Jan 2026**. The application results for the 2nd Phase will be known on **6 Jan 2025 from 9 a.m.**
3. Unsuccessful applicants can appeal under the **3rd Phase (Final Top-up Phase)** between **9 Jan and 16 Jan 2026 and 22 Jan to 6 Feb 2026** for courses with vacancies. The application results for the 3rd Phase will be known between **12 Jan and 22 Jan 2026** and **22 Jan and 11 Feb 2026**.

Summary (Application to ITE)

- Main Phase ends on **22 Dec 2025**
- Late applications will still be accepted by ITE via two additional phases
 - Appeal Phase/Late Application
26 Dec 2025 to 2 Jan 2026
 - Final Top-Up Phase
1st Top-up Phrase Application
9 Jan 2026 to 16 Jan 2026
2nd Top-up Phrase Application
22 Jan 2026 to 6 Feb 2026

Key Pointers for Students on ITE's Joint Intake Exercise (JIE)

ALL students in N(T) and N(A) students (who are not progressing to 5N(A) or repeating 4N(A)) are eligible for JIE.
Those who were unsuccessful in EAE are also eligible for JIE.

Apply in the 1st JIE main phase in December.

Use all 12 JIE choices wisely, as competition for 3-year Higher Nitec courses is keen!

Do consult your teachers / ECG counsellors to help you make your choices!

Do use the Last Aggregate Score (LAS) published in ITE's admission portal to help you make your course choices.

You are eligible for Enhanced Foundation Programme (EFP) if you receive an invitation letter to the EFP addressed to you and a copy of invitation letter for your parent/guardian.

If you are eligible for EFP, make sure you apply for both the 4-Year and 3-Year Higher Nitec Course.

The EFP helps to build the necessary literacy and numeracy foundations!

If you are counter-offered a course, accept it first to secure a place in ITE, before appealing for another course you may be more interested in!

Polytechnic Foundation Programmes (PFP)

Applications for the PFP will be open on the day of 2025 O-Level results release.

Secondary 4 N(A) students who intend to apply for the PFP should first progress to Secondary 5 on 2 January 2026.

All PFP- bound students are required to attend their Secondary 5N(A) classes in their secondary schools up till the last Friday of January 2026, i.e. 30 January 2026.

Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP)

Applications for the DPP will be from
18 Dec, 2.30pm to 22 Dec, 5pm.

2026 Sec 5NA students who are newly eligible after taking into account their O-Level examination results can also apply DPP under its final application phrase in Jan 2026.

APPEAL FOR REVIEW OF RESULTS

Appeal Fees

CERTIFICATE AMENDEMENT REQUEST

Candidates may request for a reprint of their current year examination certificate if their name was printed wrongly due to a **spelling error and did not reflect the name which they registered for their examination.** Other reasons for reprinting certificates will not be accepted.

There is an administrative fee of S\$50.00 (inclusive of GST) for the amendment of each GCE N-Level certificate.

Request to be submitted by **26 Dec 2025**

STEP 1

Consider your Values, Interests, Personality & Skills (VIPS) and how they align with options or courses you are eligible for.

STEP 2

Explore and research on options:

- Subject contents & syllabus / course objectives & modules
- Progression opportunities
- Career prospects

STEP 3

Consider chances of being posted into desired courses in JCs/M, Polytechnics and/or ITE, using the *last aggregate scores as a reference.

*For last aggregate scores, refer to JAE/JIE booklet

STEP 4

Shortlist up to 12 choices, ensuring that you include at least a few choices* where you stand a high chance of being posted to.

STEP 5

Rank your 12 choices according to your preferences.

There are at least 3 admissions exercises with different schedules: PFP, DPP, JIE-N. Encourage your students to be open to all available admission options to increase the likelihood of being posted to a course.

How to Maximise the 12 Choices

Note that JIE-H (DPP) and JIE-N are **two separate admission exercises** with different schedules. Same principles apply for PFP (5 choices).



Passion Basket

Consider the courses that **most align** with your strengths and interests.

1st 3 – 4 Choices



Practical Basket

Choose what you are **interested in** and **stand a good chance** in securing. Consider the latest aggregate scores of the courses in each institution (where your net score is **within** the range of the last year's aggregate score).

Next 3 – 4 Choices



Prudence Basket

Include alternative courses where the latest aggregate scores are **higher** than yours. With this, your chances of securing a place will be higher.

Last 3–4 choices

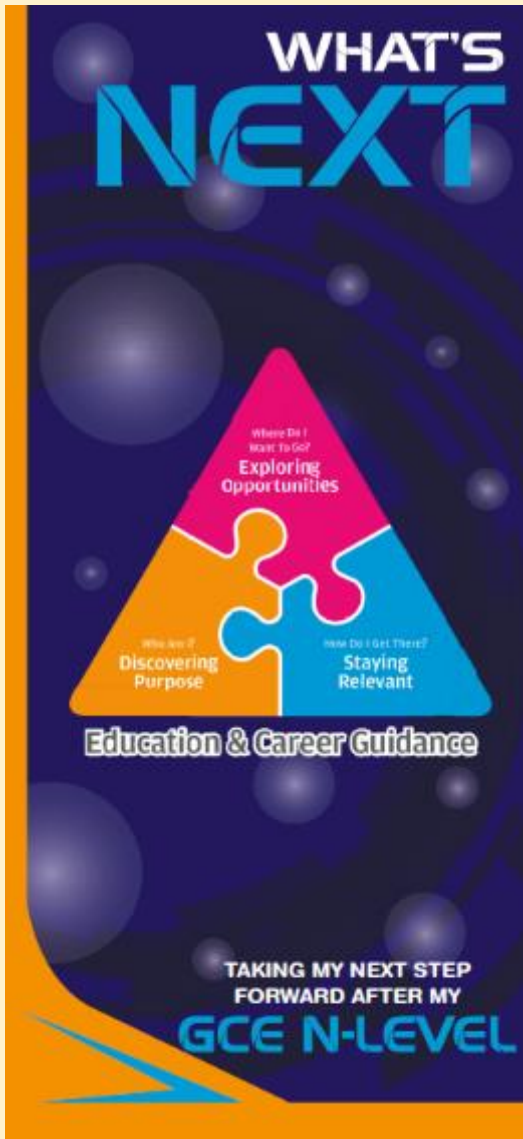

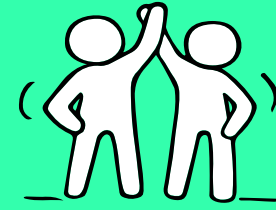

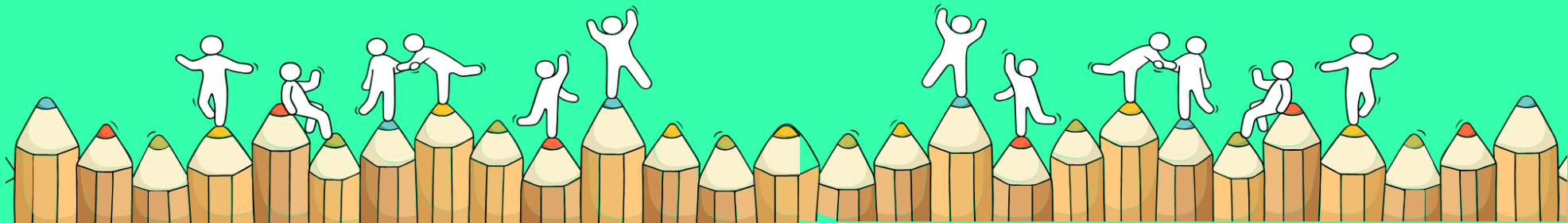
